Dear Pastor and Church,

In the life of a missionary, results never come quickly. Everything is a beginning, from food to the cultural aspect. Some begin by learning the language, and others by trying to acclimatize to the culture. In the midst of all this, we have a willing heart and are ready to work where we see the need. It could be a city or a village. Our eyes not only see the physical and material need, but what hurts most is knowing they need a Savior to reach heaven.

A year ago, we started a new church in La Dalia, an hour from Matagalpa. I began visiting house to house, sharing the gospel, it was during that visit that I met Mr. Nelson, his two children, and his mother. That day I gave him the plan of salvation and invited him to church, but he never came. This year, I continue working in the Dalia, and on Saturday, June 21, I went back to that same house, found him, and invited him again. I didn't have much hope that he would come, but that Sunday he arrived with his children, and since then he has attended every church service. Even last Sunday, when we had to travel an hour and a half to the church in Matagalpa, he came. What impacted me most that day were his words: "I never thought you would remember my house." These words reminded me of the verse in 2 Corinthians 4:1: "If we have the ministry, why should we faint? The work is of God and the results are from Him." We are praying for Nelson and his family that he may know Jesus as Savior. I am sure God will do it. Right now, I'm traveling three days a week to La Dalia, Tuesdays and Saturdays, and on Sundays, I have the women's class and the children's class.

Everyone was nervous, and none of them knew much about Bible stories. Seeing them now, how strong they are at teaching and learning. Their knowledge of God is profound, and as they say, "We're not the best, but we try." They simply want to serve and have unleashed their hidden talents to do so wholeheartedly.
